Vicar's Annual Report

The Lord provided us with many delightful blessings in 2010. Most importantly we observed of our 200th anniversary; which gave us pause to marvel at the gathering of generations of sisters and brothers in Christ over two centuries giving glory, honor, and praise to Jesus, as Grace Church, Waterford. Throughout the year we engaged in various activities and planning to celebrate this glorious occasion. In March we celebrated with a community hymn sing, and on October 2nd under the officiating of Bp Bill Love, we celebrated an anniversary Holy Eucharist, followed by a luncheon, here in our fellowship hall.

In 2010, Grace Church, again participated in the Cohoes/Waterford "Octave of Prayer", through attendance at various worship and prayer services held January 15-24 in several different churches. Grace Church hosted a healing service on January 22, 2010 attended by nearly 80 persons. The power of the Holy Spirit was so evident that we have been asked to host another Healing Service this year (2011) as our contribution to the ecumenical week of prayer. Each month in 2010, Grace Church has held a Prayer, Praise and Healing service (usually held on the second Wednesday evening of each month). While attendance is small in number the fruits of this ministry have been large for those who participate. In the spring of 2010, Grace Church participated in a joint venture with St Luke's, Mechanicville; St George's, Clifton Park, and Trinity, Lansingburgh; in teaching Level One of the School of Healing Prayer. Grace Church initiated the training of six persons for healing prayer ministry. Grace Church will be conducting training in Level two of the School of Healing Prayer in spring 2011. This will further empower and enrich our Healing Prayer Ministers.

Weekly celebrations of the Eucharist have continued throughout 2010 at the VanSchoonhoven Square Senior Apartments. This small satellite congregation was made up of 5 regular attendees. In 2011 the number of persons worshipping has decreased, due to residents who have moved out of the location. We are hopeful to increase the congregation size as new residents move into the facility. The Eucharists have been celebrated by myself and assisting clergy at Grace Church. Many thanks to Laura Mara who is devoted to Altar Guild ministry at the site; she faithfully prepares the Altar each Thursday morning. Other weekday Eucharists include holy days and the monthly Vestry meetings. The total number of weekday Eucharists in 2010 was 64. Our Sunday (including 3 Saturday vigil services: Easter, 200th Anniversary & Christmas day) services for 2010 total 107, with an average Sunday attendance of 63. This is down from our previous two year averages: 2008 = 64.5 and 2009 = 68.4. This average

remains higher than the average Sunday attendance of 2007 = 56. Of importance to note is the increase in pastoral care visits to the sick and shut in. In 2010, the pastoral care team and clergy recorded 105 occasions of bringing the Eucharist to parishioners unable to attend the Sunday worship. (This is more than double the number of "private Eucharists" provided in 2009). The increase in the need for the ministry well accounts for the decrease in the Sunday worship attendance; and in many instances more than one person received the sacrament in these visits. I want to extend a great thank you to the lay pastoral care visitors who minister many hours each month to bring the blessed sacrament to our brothers and sisters in Christ and serve as a vital link to the parish community for these persons and their families.

Bible Study has consistently been a part of the life of Grace Church. In 2010 two studies were completed: the Book of Psalms and the book of Revelation. In the fall 2010, a scripture based study of the ministry of Jesus Christ was initiated and will be completed early in 2011.

The Confirmation sacramental preparation was conducted by Fr Chip Strickland in the spring of 2010. On May 8, 2010, Grace Church participated in a regional confirmation service held at St George's, Clifton Park, where four of our adults were either confirmed, received or reaffirmed: Regina Lee – received; Ryan Greenhall – Confirmed; Heath Decelle – reaffirmed; and Gina Thompson – received. In February 2010, Bp Bill (by special request) received Michael Zone into the Episcopal Church while Michael was in the hospice unit at St Mary's Hospital, Troy. Four baptisms were conducted in 2010: Amber E. Fosmire, Nathan E. Skaarup (Baby Nathan), Aubrielle Blanchette, and Emma Mariah Charest.

Our congregation experienced the loss of two dear brothers in Christ, Michael Zone and Donald Dudden. In addition to the officiating of these bittersweet funerals, the Grace Church clergy assisted with other burial and funeral services for persons outside of our congregation for a total of 7 burials.

A Lenten Quiet Day was held on March 27, 2010 and facilitated by Dcn Alicia Todaro. Dcn Alicia encouraged us in various forms of prayer, Christian readings and meditations. On Good Friday, Grace Church participated for the second year, in a community walk of the Way of the Cross. This is becoming an inter-denominational annual event to publically observe the death of Jesus on the cross.

On May 1, 2010, the marriage of Melissa Coons to Michael Holtzman was celebrated at the Canfield Casino, Saratoga, NY. Mtr Kathy co-officiated with a Jewish Cantor and Fr Herbert was the preacher. This was the only marriage for the Grace Church community in 2010.

Grace Church's "adopted" seminarian, Rose Ann Felty, was ordained to the diaconate on June 5, 2010. Deacon Rose Ann subsequently moved from Wisconsin to Waterford in July, where she temporarily resided in the rectory. While here, Deacon Rose Ann served on the clergy team assisting in pastoral care, Sunday and weekday services; and was instrumental in launching a prayer table ministry. The Lord provided her to the congregation in the midst of the transition of Fr William "Chip" Strickland from Grace Church to St Paul's Greenwich. On June 27, 2010, we bid farewell and launched Fr Chip (& "Sunny" puppet) into his new mission ministry.

In June 2010, at the annual Diocesan Convention our Grace Church King's Kids team led the Vacation Bible School. Our team and several Grace Church children (as well as the puppets) were greatly blessed by this ministry and shared our mission of "fanning the flame of our youngest disciples" with the diocese at large. In addition, the puppet ministry led a workshop at the convention, introducing to the participants the way in which the puppet ministry is able to break open the Word of God to children of all ages (adults included). Feedback received has indicated we will be asked to offer the workshop again at the 2011 Convention. The Grace Church delegation at the convention included parishioners from every age bracket and many more persons than our elected delegates. Convention has become a family reunion event for many of us.

Our parish picnic was held on July 18, 2010, in addition to "mass in the grass" and our shared meal, we received a surprise visit from the descendent of a parishioner who worshiped at Grace Church in the late 1800s. This woman (Natalie), who traveled from Virginia, was searching for information regarding her ancestors and discovered her "roots" at Grace Church. Natalie returned in October to celebrate the 200th anniversary and has said Grace Church is a home to her.

In the spring and summer of 2010, under the leadership of Tammy Wrest, Grace Church conducted a "Financial Peace" course. The Christian based course was provided to fulfill requests from parishioners and persons outside of the parish community. This was the second time the parish offered the course which has provided its participants with a framework for understanding and planning their finances

2010 was the first year Grace Church did not participate in the Waterford Tug Boat Round-Up. This three day event had historically been used as a fund raising opportunity for our parish, however this year, there were few persons who had signed up to assist in staffing the booth, and therefore the parish cancelled participation. Our participation in the annual Canal Fest did continue at the May 2010 event.

In October the parish not only celebrated the 200th anniversary but also held a children & youth Harvest Night celebration. This alternative to Halloween, attracted many children from in and outside of the parish.

Cursillo remains an important renewal ministry for Grace Church. This ministry has provide an opportunity for many of our parishioners to renew their passion for Jesus and His call on us. The parish includes over 20 Cursillistas; including two parishioners who were candidates on the first Cursillo weekend offered in the Diocese of Albany – Norma Picard and Laura Mara. In 2010 two of our parishioners served on the team for the Men's Cursillo – Heath DeCelle and Jim Tarullo. The 2010 Women's weekend included, myself as the spiritual director and several of our women as candidates; Dcn Rose Ann, Deb DeCelle, Deb Wulff and Gina Lee. I have accepted the call to assist at the diocesan level as a spiritual advisor for Cursillo and we already have men who will be serving on team for the upcoming men's weekend. The Troy Area Ultreya continues to meet at Grace Church each month and is well attended by the Cursillistas of Grace Church.

For the first time ever, Grace Church, held a quiet morning on a Saturday in Advent 2010; this time of having the church open for quiet prayer and reconciliation, coincided with the outreach ministries first "Can you use this?" day. The foot traffic in and out created an opportunity for persons to come into the church for prayer and ministry.

Our Christmas Eve family Eucharist was an unforgettable celebration. We were blessed with the surprise participation of a live lamb brought for the Christmas pageant by the Charest family; many children and babies in attendance; children spontaneously bursting into song; and a homeless gentleman seeking warmth and sustenance. The Sunday following Christmas, one of parishioners shared with me, this was the best service she had ever attended. She remarked at how "alive" this parish is, as demonstrated by all of the blessed activity in the service.

Let us offer thanksgiving for the life of this parish, for the joy we are experiencing in the lord, for the many people who are coming through our doors each Sunday and throughout the week; and for the children and youth in our midst. We are very much focused on our mission to "share the joy of Jesus". The more we remain focused on Him and the growth of His kingdom; the more the lord will bless our efforts to serve His people.

In 2011, we look forward to: developing our Men's Ministry; raising up men and women as candidates for Cursillo; growing our Prayer Table ministry; inviting and welcoming persons to worship; developing monthly youth ministry activities; further integration with the Ecumenical community of churches in Waterford, Cohoes and Green Island; and providing opportunities to serve others in the name of Jesus such as a suggestion of a monthly community meal.

Thank you to Bill Grochmal who has served one term as warden; Jill Simoncic who has served two terms as Vestry member; and Bonnie Zone who served one term as Vestry

member. We greatly appreciate your ministry of leadership and look forward to the new ministries the Lord has for each of you.

Thank you to Fr Herbert who continues to serve at Grace Church. He stepped down as Music Director in the summer and has continued to: preach on a regular basis; provide puppet ministry with "Grandpa" puppet; provide healing prayer following the 9:30 service; supply during the Vicar's vacations; and give much prayer and encouragement for all of us. He is a great blessing to our community.

I am humbled and blessed to serve as Vicar of Grace, Waterford, and continue to marvel and rejoice at the works the Lord is doing in and through us.

CALL TO ORDER:

The Rev. Katherine Alonge-Coons **officially called the annual meeting to order** with an opening prayer at the start of the 7:30 a.m. service. Approximately **65** people were in attendance. to vote following the 9:30 service There were a sufficient number of attendees to be a quorum. During the meeting and ministry celebration everyone shared a covered dish luncheon.

Preside: Cindy Baker made a motion **Mother Kathy, vicar, preside** over the Annual Meeting. Bill Grochmal seconded. Attendees approved.

The **minutes of the Annual Meeting of 2009** were read. Mary Ellen Reilly-Scott made a motion the minutes be approved; Jim Tarullo seconded. Attendees approved.

Mother Kathy led parishioners in **thanking Carol Lessard** for countless years of service on the Vestry and as assistant treasurer.

Vanessa Gleason was nominated to serve a two-year term as warden. Rose Tokarz was nominated to run for re-election as a Vestry member for another three-year term, and Richard Lenihan as a Vestry member. Cinny Quantock made a motion that being

the candidates were unopposed, Terry Brown, the clerk of the Vestry, cast one official vote on the behalf of the parish. Jim Tarullo seconded. Attendees approved.

Vicar Report: Mother Kathy presented her Vicar Report and noted how God has continued to bless this parish. She noted the average attendance increased from the 2008 average attendance of 64.5 to 68.4 in 2009.

One hundred and five Sunday services were celebrated. Four marriages (Michael Wilmut and Sabrina Petruska, Jason Rich and Victoria Kelts, Mary Ellen Reilly and David Scott, Steve Rist and Daniel Marcy), two burials (Frank Fera and Cheryl Smith) and two baptisms (John McWhinie Jr. and Jackie Shryer-Praga) were held at Grace Church . Sixty-five weekday services, including those at Van Schoonhen Square Apartments, and more than 45 private services were celebrated,

Grace Church joined Christian congregations from Waterford, Cohoes and Green Island in offering praise and thanksgiving unto the Lord in the Octave of Prayer for Christian Unity.

Mother Kathy is grateful for the services of teammates Revs. Chip Strickland and Herbert Sanderson.

Grace Waterford's relationship with the Methodist and Wesleyan Churches of Waterford continues to grow.

Mother Kathy's full Vicar Report and other ministry reports are in the attached annual report booklet.

The **50th anniversary of Father Herbert's ordination** was celebrated on Dec. 19. Father Chip launched a successful Youth Ministry, led a well-attended Alpha Youth Rally and helped organized fun activities for village youths.

200th Anniversary: Fay Catallo says planning for the celebration is continuing. More events are planned. The church's history is being updated.

Adult Christian Education topics included "From Your Dream to Your Destiny", "Conquer Your Fear, Share Your Faith" and "Effective Stewardship."

Altar Guild: Cindy Baker, Deb Mathesen, Jill Simoncic and Judy Tarullo served. Babara Cicchinelli, who bakes communion bread, and Laura Mara, who does setup and cleanup duty at VanSchoonhoven Apartments services, are auxiliary members.

Communications Ministry: Kevin Coffrin, webmaster, revamped and added links to Website, and led operation of sound system. He added a Grace Church Twitter, a community bulletin board. Colleen Laven designed and produced weekly bulletins, and News Sheets, monthly Grace Notes, special occasion programs, posters and flyers for many ministries, Welcome Packet materials and the Annual Report. She also maintains Grace's Facebook, a social networking website. Canny Quantock and Mary Ellen Reilly-Scott assembled 100 Welcome Packets. The ministry sent out 36 press releases to

increase public awareness of Grace Church and to help grow God's Kingdom here. Announcements appeared in the Times Union, Troy Record, Schenectady Gazette, Penny Savers, Saratogian, Spotlight newspapers and other publications in the region. Times Warner Cable ran announcements of fundraisers.

Hospitality: Bonnie Zone, Gina Lee, and James and Barbara Chiccineli, Jim Tarullo, Rose Tokarz and others make Coffee Hours possible.

Intercessory Prayer Ministry: Prayer Warriors led by Linda Grochmal pray daily for protection of Grace Church, spiritual nourishment, presence of the Holy Spirit, growth in numbers, Sharing the Joy of Jesus, the clergy, prayer-chain members, all other ministries, and parishioners and families.

King's Kids Sunday School: Vanessa Gleason reported 22 children are enrolled. Two children attended Beaver Cross camp for two weeks. Thirteen children attended Jesus is Our Super Hero Vacation Bible School Six children attended the Diocese Convention. Twelve children participated in a Living Nativity in the Waterford Christmas Parade. Thirteen children participated in Christmas Pageant. Twenty-two explorers attended Liberty Ridge Corn Maze event.

Men's Ministry: Attendees explored biblical passages and discussed possible ways to apply those passages to every day life, including at work. Attendees shared what's going on in their lives.

Music Ministry: Father Herbert Sanderson leads the down front ensemble - singers and musicians. Rick Hacker is organist. Father Herbert notes there have been noticeable gains in the effectiveness of the Music Ministry as demonstrated by the quality and participation level of the congregation.

Outreach: The ministry provided two Beaver Cross scholarships. Grace Church continues to sponsor two children's education in Dominican Republic and assisted Judy Tarullo and Debbie Burns during mission working Appalachia.

Outreach provided 18 Thanksgiving food baskets, and 19 Christmas food baskets as well as children's gifts. The Christmas project served 28 children and 30 adults. No Child Left Behind provided school supplies to children. Outreach also provided Harriet Moore-Shank and Frank and Anne Farrago Music scholarships. Food Pantry is now serving about 25 families a month. Extra Helpings has generated \$85 profit to Grace Church.

Parish Nurse Ministry: Rose Tokarz changed the ministry name to **Faith Based Community Nurse Ministry**. The ministry relocated to the Rectory. She and helpers conduct blood pressure clinics at Grace Church and at Van Schoonhoven Square Apartments. Twenty-eight people graduated from Defy Diabetes Healthy Living Classes. Rose Tokarz conducted another health survey to determine better ways to meet parish's health needs. Helpful and healthy information posted on Parish Hall bulletin board.

Pastoral Care: Denise Moore joined Carol Lessard, Cindy Baker, Bill and Linda Grochmal, Jim Tarullo, Frank Dooris and Carol Lessard in making pastoral visits to the ill and shut-ins. The clergy also made visits.

Prayer Chain Ministry: Gina Lee and 10 other members have prayed for 129 people and situations. These included prayers for people who have lost jobs for healing, and strength and peace while dealing with death of a loved-one.

Rick Tokarz says **Property projects and expenses** included cleaning heating system, Time-Warner security, Terminex pest control, janitor supplies, basement cleaning and painting, refurb basement and alley stairway, and cleaned out rectory basement.

Treasurer's Report: Mary Ann Kelts says contributions increased. A total of \$60,723 contributed. Church reduced the need to draw from endowment to zero to cover operations expenses. Grace Church ended the year in the black - \$695. Last year, contributions totaled \$55,860. Carol Lessard assists by writing checks and Earl Coons serves as head counter.

Welcoming Ministry: Greeters made all who passed through the Green Doors feel welcome. A diverse group of ushers served, passing out bulletins and gave visitors Welcome Packets. They also encouraged others to deliver bread and wine to altar.

Youth Ministry: Father Chip and volunteers focused on ministering to young people between 10 and 18 years through special events, including a Youth Alpha Rally, Harvest Night and Game Night. Volunteers also provide a fun and safe place for youth to socialize and learn about Christ. The Christian rock band Caught Up from Wesleyan Church entertained.

As a sidebar to the Annual Meeting, Mother Kathy convened the Vestry for a way to help victims of earthquake disaster in Haiti. Richard Lenihan made a motion Grace Church donate \$1,000 from Outreach funds to Haiti relief efforts. Bill Grochmal seconded. Vestry approved.

Vestry also approved **postponing January Vestry** meeting from Jan. 19 to Tuesday, Jan. 26.

ADJOURNMENT: Cindy Baker made a motion meeting be adjourned; Bill Grochmal seconded the motion. The meeting adjourned at 12:30 p.m. after a closing prayer.

We had a meeting in May where the procedures were gone over and some changes were made.

Colleen Laven and Denise Moore serve as our weekly bulletin editors and produce Grace Notes each month. Denise is filling in for Colleen during maternity leave. Colleen produced an excellent Church Bulletin for Grace Church's Oct. 2 Anniversary Celebration.

Welcome: Canny Quantock and Mary Ellen Reilly-Scott have produced additional Welcome Packets that include a bookmark that lists ministries, a welcome letter, a post card, and a get acquainted card that a visitor can fill out and a Spiritual Life Center brochure.

Public Affairs: The ministry has sent out 41 releases. Grace Church announcements, features and news are appearing in the Times Union, Troy Record, Schenectady Gazette, Penny Savers, Saratogian, My River Life, Spotlight newspapers and other publications in the region. Grace Church also is highlighted on the new Web community bulletin board SoSara. Time Warner Cable has ran announcements of our fundraisers. 96.7 FM Pulse, WPTR radio station broadcasts Grace events. Boy Scouts delivered a portion of their November holiday food drive to us. A thank you note has been sent.

A Food Pantry donation was received from the Waterford Elementary School, and from St. Mary's, Crescent. Notes sent. We received a donation of food pantry items from the Waterford Women's Club. The Wesleyan Methodist Church continues to bring us toilet articles they collect for 2 food pantries-items not available with food stamps. In October 2010, we became members of the Food Pantries for the Capital District, for Saratoga County. On December 7th, the Just Say Yes to Fruits and Vegetables was to have been to Grace for food demo, a workshop for eating healthy and a door prize giveaway. Canceled until a later date.

Our “Can You Use This” table has become very popular. We have walk-ins just to look and hopefully pick up a bargain. Gina, Vanessa and Karen will be having a special day-Dec. 11th for the opportunity to have many items that have already been donated to us available to utilize the types of donations the Outreach Ministry has been receiving. PARISH NURSE MINISTRY

Through the hard work of the members we were able to sponsor a community Health Fair which was a big success. The health fair was also the launching point for the New Beginnings Support Group led by Linda Grochmal. This group is ongoing in 2011. A special honor was bestowed upon our own Mother Kathy as she was named “Clergy of the Year” by the Seton Health Parish Nurse organization. She was honored at a luncheon at our Spiritual Life Center this fall. It was an honor to nominate her. 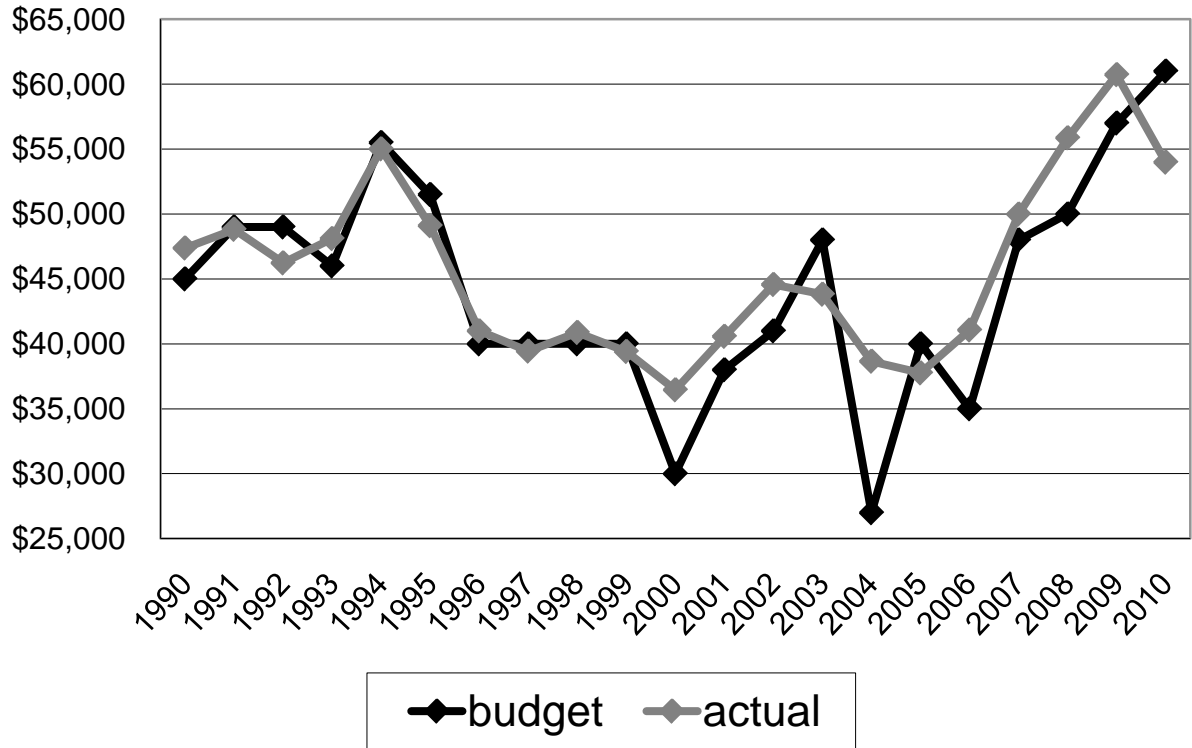
